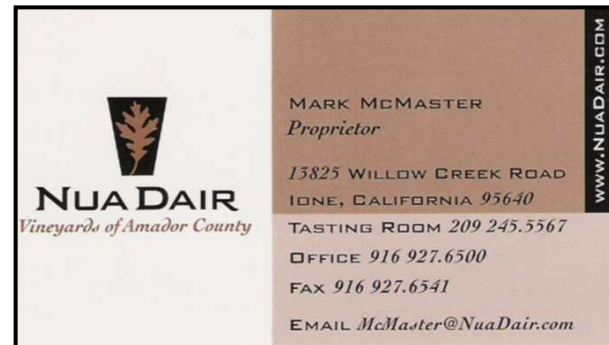



## **BANSHEE FLEET ONE**




