## VICE-COMMODORE'S REPORT

Yes, we held the singlehanded race, and 5 boats came out. I was there, along with Mack Bishop in our Santana 20s. Dave Strain made it out in his Catalina 22, along with George Koch in this Lido 14 and Wade Behling in this Thistle.

The first race was held in very light winds (it is a good thing that the lake has a 5mph speed limit so we didn't have too many wakes to deal with)! We got a little breeze near the end of the race. The 2<sup>nd</sup> race was held in decent wind, and the wind was perfect for the 3<sup>rd</sup> race.

When all was done, Dave Strain was first in the keelboat class and George Koch won the dinghy class. They both won \$25 West Marine gift certificates. Thanks to Steve Galeria, Gary Preston, new member Rob Cram and Rob's crew (who's name I managed to forget) for doing Race Committee duties, and for assisting the racers in getting their boats in and out of the water (as well as pulling a MacGregor 26 from the shore when its little electric motor couldn't).

## **Great Pumpkin Regatta**Richmond Yacht Club

Steve Galeria and Austin Quilty joined me as we raced in Richmond Yacht Club's Great Pumpkin regatta on October 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. Three buoy races were planned for Saturday (a windward – leeward – windward course, with the finish line near the windward mark), and a pursuit race around Alcatraz and Angel Islands was planned for Sunday.

Five Santana 20s signed up for the regatta (over 250 boats total), but one wasn't able to make it out to the course on Saturday. We were racing in the Southampton shoals area, which is in the lee of Angel Island. And a big lee it was. By 2:00, we had managed to finish one race while the boats racing on the other areas of the bay had great wind and were already on the way back in! Meanwhile, we barely saw 5 knots most of the day, and in fact had to anchor for over an hour during a big flood tide and no wind while waiting for the 1st race to start.

We had an OK start in the first race (we were starting with the Santana 22s and Cal 20s), but got pushed out of phase when a Santana 22 tacked on top of us. By the time we got back in phase, were had been pushed back and rounded the first mark in 3<sup>rd</sup> place, just a boat length in front of the 4<sup>th</sup> place boat (In-and-Out, from Oregon). We did a great job on the downwind leg, and managed to move way up and round the leeward mark in 2<sup>nd</sup> place, just behind the leader (Sea Bear). And that's where we finished.

The  $2^{nd}$  race saw us get a great start and Sea Bear over early. We sailed a nearly perfect race and nobody ever got near us, so we won, with Giddy Up (also from Oregon) in  $2^{nd}$  place.

Did I mention this was the first time I raced my boat in the Bay? And that as a lake sailor, currents are some abstract thing that other people talk about? That changed in the 3<sup>rd</sup> race. By now, the flood tide that we had to anchor in to keep from drifting back to the breakwater had turned into a very strong ebb tide. We knew that, and we fought it, but it still managed to push us over the line at the start of the 3<sup>rd</sup> race. By the time we realized it, and slowing sailed back in the light breeze, we were probable 4-5 minutes behind the rest of the fleet. And we were not able to catch up. At the front of the fleet, Sea Bear rounded the leeward mark in front just as the wind died. He had to do some evasive maneuvering, including a crash tack, to avoid being pushed into the mark. Inand-Out, in 2<sup>nd</sup> place, was able to learn from that and went a couple of boat lengths past the mark before they headed up. They took off to the right is a decent breeze while Sea Bear floundered on the left in nothing. By the time they got going, In-and-Out was long gone and won the race.

So, after the 3 races were done, we ended up in a three-way tie for the lead. Sea Bear and Fusion had identical scores of 1, 2, and 4 while In-and-Out had 3, 3, and 1. And Giddy Up was just a couple points behind with 4, 2, 3. When all the tie breakers were applied, Sea Bear ending up first, we were in 2<sup>nd</sup> and In-and-Out was 3<sup>rd</sup>.

All of the talk on Sunday morning was about which way to go. Do you optimize for the wind or for the tide. We kept flopping back and forth, but with light breezes expected, we figured we needed to go for the wind. But all that discussion (and boat rigging and time and everything else) was for naught. At 11:50, the RC put up the postponement flag since there was barely enough breeze to stay in one place! By 1:30, with still no wind in sight, they cancelled the race. We had decided about 15 minutes earlier that even if we started then, there was no way we could finish before the time limit. So we got out the outboard, grabbed Giddy Up, and started motoring in. So, we didn't do the real race, but we did really well in the race to the hoist!



## GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING October 9, 2007

## **RBOC**REQUEST FOR LETTERS

Recreational Boaters of California, RBOC, has issued a call to e-mail our US House of Representatives and US Senate. This is from the most recent issue of the PICYA Log, Sept/Oct 2007, volume XXII, No.5.

"Contact your congressman and senators. RBOC is urging boaters to contact their representatives in the US House and US Senate, urging them, to support H.R. 2550, legislation that would protect boaters from having to obtain and pay for a new permit. Fortunately, the Recreational Boating Act of 2007 (H.R. 2550) has been introduced by Representatives Gene Taylor (D-Miss) and Candice Miller (R-Mich) which would protect recreational boats from being swept into this unnecessary and expensive permitting system. It is critically important that H.R. 2550 be passed and boater support is essential. Please contact you Congressman and Senator TODAY and ask that they co-sponsor or support H.R. 2550. If the permit system becomes a reality, you will be required to pay for a state permit for each of your boats. EPA will be monitoring your deck runoff, grey water, bilge water, engine cooling water, and the use of copper bottom paints. Please ask your elected federal representatives to support H.R. 2550. It is common sense legislation.
