Dear fellow FLYC members,

Thank you for your vote of confidence in selecting me to be your next Commodore and thanks to all of those who volunteered their time and energy to fill out our slate of officers. FLYC is facing some changes in 2011. Some of these changes will be exciting and most

will be challenging but I do know that in order to face them successfully, the club membership will need to participate. You will probably be tired of hearing this from me before the year is out, but I firmly believe that without a significant increase in participation, this club will not succeed and grow.

Many people will hear the word "participate" and assume I mean that there is a burden to shoulder and work to be done so that others may have a good time. In fact, what I would like everyone to think about is what it means to have a yacht club and be a member. In my mind, participating in a club like this is all about spending time in the company of people I enjoy who share an interest in sailing.

Over the course of the year, your Club officers will make a greater attempt to keep you informed of activities and urge your involvement. The new Clubhouse project will take a lot of effort on everyone's part, and there are always maintenance projects and regattas to run, but I would like to put the "Party" back into Work Party as much as possible. It doesn't matter if you don't think you have the critical skills or physical ability necessary to do a project. We need to look at these activities not just as necessary chores, but as another opportunity to socialize and strengthen the fellowship of the club. This is particularly important for the newer members. It will give them a chance to meet everyone and form new friendships, as well as giving them a stake in the club and a true feeling of contribution. Please keep this in mind when your officer's ask you for your participation during the year.

Which brings us to the sailing. This last year was one of the best I've ever seen for wind and water on Folsom Lake. The only thing missing was the sailors. There isn't much I can say about this that's not obvious. The point of being in a sailing club is to go sailing. If you have a boat, get it out there. If you don't have a boat use the club to get a crew position. If you have a boat and no crew, see the previous sentence. When there aren't enough boats out there on a race day, people will stop attending and potential new mem-

bers will assume, correctly, that nothing is going on and will leave. Additionally, I have always considered the after-race party to be a fun and important part of these events. For some time they virtually disappeared, but now they are making a comeback. Unless they have vital, pressing business, all racers need to make an effort to attend, and not just pack up their boats and leave after the race.

Participating on a race committee can be fun and is a great way to learn how to race. Most importantly, you can't have a race without race committee, and we are going back to an assigned RC system that we have used in years past. FLYC members will be assigned race committee days which will be posted on the FLYC website. As the assigned member, you will either run the race committee that day, or be responsible for finding a replacement. Your new Vice Commodore, Dave Strain, will work with you to confirm in advance that RC is covered and ensure that there are enough skilled bodies to handle running the race. If RC is not confirmed in advance for that event, the race will be canceled for lack of RC. One of our first membership meetings of the year will cover running race committee and members are strongly urged to attend.

Our format for membership meetings is also going to change, somewhat. We are putting together a schedule of useful and, hopefully, entertaining presentations. For the present time the meetings will remain at Morrison Marine, but the emphasis will be less on club business and more on socializing. In addition to boating related presentations, the club will also provide some food and drink. Meetings will be a time to meet with friends, have a bite to eat, learn something useful and just have a good time.

With our current level of membership, it is certainly going to be a challenging time, but it is also a hopeful and exciting time full of potential for growth. We have several new and younger members, we have two one-design fleets making a comeback, we have a new clubhouse project and possibly new options to involve youth sailors and provide a cruising fleet to members. Your flyc.org website and the electronic Telltale will be the primary sources of information. Use them to keep up on the latest news.

Annual Awards Banquet Report

To wrap up my tenure as Commodore, here's a recap I put together about the FLYC annual banquet:

I started the festivities by thanking Madeline Rayfuse, Lanette Strain, and Stephanie Erdrich for putting together the banquet and raffle, and for doing a great job decorating the tables.

Next was a recap of the results for the year and the awarding of the awards for the Spring and Fall series, followed by my announcement of the recipients of the FLYC annual awards:

For his work on the Telltale and creating a FLYC presence on Facebook, Mark Werder was awarded the Dan Buckley Journalism award.

For his work in keeping the marks in place and other maintenance tasks, Kerry Johnson was awarded the FLYC Sportsmanship award.

For donating the use of his shop for the monthly membership meetings and for the work he donated during the Coho repair project, Mel Morrison was awarded the Golden Cleat award.

Then we reached the first of the main events for the meeting. The discussion started regarding the clubhouse proposal. After much debate, a motion was made to "Purchase a houseboat to be placed in the dry storage lot overlooking

the Browns Ravine Marina. Total expenditure for the project not to exceed \$10,000". The vote came out to 14 members in favor and 2 opposed. I already had received 4 votes opposed via the 'absentee' email address, so the motion passed 14 to 6.

Next up was discussion about the creation of a new membership class and acquiring the use of a couple of small keelboats from the California Delta Youth Maritime Association. A motion was made to come up with a final proposal including costs. This proposal passed with just one member opposed.

The final piece of business was electing a new board. Most of the board chose to continue their roles for 2011, except for myself and the Vice Commodore. Asking for nominations, Todd Craig said he was willing to accept the role of Commodore with just one proviso: There must be a Vice Commodore. Unfortunately nobody was willing to step up as Vice Commodore.

After some discussion, it was decided to elect the rest of the board, and have them continue with a search for a Vice Commodore.

As you probably read elsewhere, later Dave Strain volunteered to fill the role of the Vice Commodore, which allowed Todd Craig to accept the Commodore role. So the 2011 board is:

On November 13th we had our first Annual Banshee Fleet Meeting and Swap Meet. With 20 people attending at one time or the other during the day it was a lot of fun and very social. HIGHLIGHTS:

Boat #41 w/trailer was auctioned off for \$550 to Todd and Barbara Craig; now they have two Banshees and both will be racing.

Two boats, #41 and #306 (owned by Craig Perez) were on display to show options for rigging a racing Banshee. These boats had everything! I'll post pictures next month.

Craig Perez, a US Sailing certified instructor and fleet member, is organizing a race clinic (class room and on the water) for all Banshee sailors at the Richmond Yacht Club; March 5&6, 2011. Nine people at the meeting, including some of the most competitive racers, indicated they would attend. More details will be published later.

Don Bain, boat #340, joined the fleet.

Charles Witcher received recognition and a trophy as the winner of the 2010 Banshee Lake Series. He participated in six of the nine events and won five of those six.

The 2011 'Lake Series' Circuit will consist of the following events: 1. Camellia Cup, 2. Whiskeytown, 3. Gold Rush, 4. High Sierra, 5. Folsom Centerboard, 6. LWSC Delta Dinghy, 7. Steele Cup, 8. RYC Total Dinghy (added), and 9. LWSC Turkey Shoot (assuming there are no conflicting dates).

The class rules were changed after an open 'give and take' discussion on the use of digital compasses. The consensus was the functionality of a digital compass, including the lift/header function, is currently available on mechanical compasses and allowed by current class rules. The membership voted; 9 for, 2 against, 1 abstained, for the following change to the class rules: **"Except for timers and digital compasses, all electrical instruments are prohibited. Mechanical timers, compasses and wind indicators are permitted."**

Again, Fleet #1 would like to thank to the Inland Sailing Company and Hart Sail Design for their continued support of sailing and the Banshee Fleet.

"Non-wire/rod backstays and checkstays are Class legal. However, the upper/lower shrouds and the forestay will remain of wire/rod construction."
